President's Letter

Dear Kolping Brothers and Sisters,

Just as you have probably experienced big challenges in 2020, so has your Catholic Kolping Society New York faced significant difficulties.

Our Mission "to promote development of the individual and family" is largely comprised of providing safe Catholic housing in Manhattan and the Bronx. At 88th Street we have traditionally housed international students and interns. In the Bronx we provide home for a variety of people from many walks of life. Our retreat at Kolping on Hudson is a place for all of our groups to relax and refresh.

During 2020, international travel has declined and so too our occupancy rates have fallen to about 10% at 88th Street. In the Bronx, some of our residents have lost jobs making it difficult to meet rent obligations. We've cut expenses and staff but a shortfall remains.

We have asked our Kolping members for their ideas and input to collaborate with the Directors. Good ideas have come from this and the offerings at 88th Street have been broadened to appeal to more potential guests. One floor has been designated for women. The requirement to be a foreign student or intern is temporarily waived and U.S. students as well as other short term visitors to NYC are welcome to stay with us. We're reaching out to families of people coming to NYC hospitals for special treatments as well as medical professionals coming to to help during the pandemic. There's even an opportunity now to rent office space on a daily or weekly basis for workers whose employment has gone "remote" and for whom working in a small apartment is just not adequate. Please help spread the word.

The time has come now to ask our members for financial support during this crisis. If you have resources and are able to make a gift to your Kolping Society, please consider doing so.

In our 100+ years in operation the Kolping Society has experienced good times and bad. We've come through them because of the generosity and hard work of our members.



ADOLPH KOLPING

Born December 8, 1813, near Cologne, German. He was the son of a shepherd.

As a young man, he was trained as a cobbler but decided he wanted to enter the priesthood. On April 13, 1845, Adolph was ordained. Industrialization in 19th-century Germany brought single men into the cities for lucrative factory jobs. When young Fr. Kolping was assigned as a parish chaplain, he got to know of these young journeymen workers, even providing them a home at the parish. He became active in an organization for journeymen, and eventually its leader.

On this day, in 1849, he founded the first Catholic journeyman's association. Today the international organization is known as the Catholic Kolping Society. This organization seeks to help its members, give Christian witness through their marriages, families, professions, and leisure activities for the betterment of culture, society and the Church.

Fr. Kolping died in 1865 in Cologne. He was beatified on October 27, 1991.

We are hopeful that our annual ski trip will happen in March 2021.


