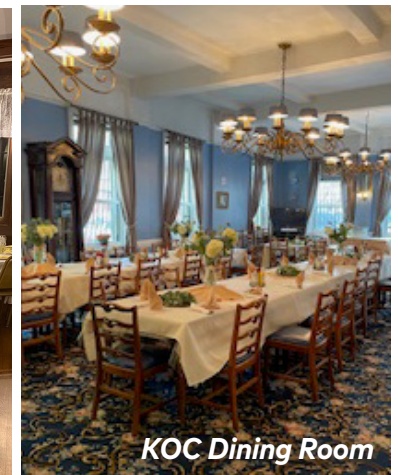

KOLPING AND VOCATIONS

The Catholic Kolping Society of New York has a project directed to supporting young people who would like to explore a trade. College is only one path and it is sometimes difficult to know where to begin to explore other options. Father Kolping worked as a shoemaker before becoming a priest and he thoroughly understood the challenges and satisfactions of being a craftsman. When he opened his first Kolping House it was to support young people as they moved away from their childhood homes to work in trades and become independent adults. Funded by a generous legacy gift, the Kolping Occupational and Vocational Apostolate project contributes to defray the employer's cost of training a young person who is endeavoring to enter a particular vocation and learn new skills. A KOVA grant is a one-time payment to help encourage an employer to take the extra time and energy of investing in training the next generation. Applications are considered on a rolling basis. KOLPING GENERAL MEETING 2026 / MINUTES

The **MINUTES** of the Annual General Meeting of the Catholic Kolping Society of New York held at 165 East 88th Street, New York, NY on March 1, 2026

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT:

Father Bretone, Gerhard Schmitt, Katrina Dengler, Tracie Truncellito, John Weigand, Ted Dengler, Peter Carruthers, Alex Schmitt, Kevin Bruegger, Donna Richardson, Al Sartorius, Jr., Jennifer Ahrens Scheuermann, Mike Scheuermann, Chuck Smith, Mia Steigerwald, and Alfred Vogl.

Father Bretone began the meeting with a prayer at 12:15 pm.

Gerhard made a motion to accept the 2025 General Meeting minutes, Tracie, seconded, motion carried.

John Weigand ran the elections for the board. Being a Presidential year Peter Carruthers and Gerhard Schmitt ran and were elected president and vice president respectively. Katrina Dengler, Ted Dengler, Mike Scheuermann, and Tracie Richardson Truncellito were elected to the Senior Board by acclimation. Jennifer Ahrens Scheuermann and Kayla Noll Aguila, new to the Board, ran and were elected for the Junior Board, with Martin Dengler being the runner up.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Given by Ted Dengler

Kolping on Concourse: This property was acquired in the eighties with the intent of providing affordable housing in the Bronx. Many upgrades and improvements have been tackled in the last five years. Some are due to aging infrastructure and some are due to local law mandates. As such transfers to KOC were provided to complete the projects. In 2025 it was decided that the transfers be considered loans. In 2023 the house received a large donation helping to offset the year's loss a bit. However, in 2024 and 2025 KOC experienced significant losses. More work on the property still needs to be done.

Kolping on Hudson: The property was acquired in the fifties. Back then there were many volunteers. Over the years they dropped off and expenses increased. At one point the Society decided to sell off the rights to develop the property to New York State. The money from the sale was put into the KOH Preservation Fund. The interest earned is used to offset expenses. In recent years there have been more volunteers stepping up and thus enabling less money to be extracted from the Preservation Fund during 2019-2023. As with all properties maintenance, upgrades, and repairs are a must and so more transfers have been made in the last 2 years to cover projects. More improvements are anticipated for the coming year and a transfer will have to be made. Last year the property experienced a loss of almost \$14,000 partly due to less income.

K88: In the seventies K88 had been losing money due to the change in the immigration laws from the

sixties. The house made up the loss of immigrant residents from Europe by allowing local people to reside long term in the house and occupancy was not high enough. At the time members loaned money to keep it afloat. Also, KOH was doing very well at the time and contributed to keeping the Society afloat. Eventually things turned around, the neighborhood improved, and the loans were paid back. It has been successful for many years now. Some of the surplus from K88 are usually transferred to the Kolping Society's General Fund to cancel out losses incurred by the Society. K88 had a \$400,000 surplus in 2025 (K88 financials are up to November 2025 only).

Society: Income was mostly dues. Since some bills are paid out of the Society, out of expediency, the Society will almost always show a deficit. Luckily, the success of K88 is helping to carry the Society.

Gerhard made a motion to accept the financials, Lisa seconded, motion carried.

HOUSE REPORTS

KOH given by Tracie:

2025 was a great season thanks to volunteers helping in the kitchen, behind the bar, setting up and breaking down events, running events, participating in projects, doing landscape work, taking care of the pool, etc. Some of the major renovations in 2025 include the library, the office, Room 1, and the other half of the roof at Hensing Wing. This year's project will include the renovation of Room 5, the second-floor hallway, painting of the barn, and more paving in anticipation of 2026 National Convention in September. Clean ups begin April 11th. The usual events will take place this year, including Mother's Day, Father's Day, the Memorial and July 4th barbeques, Murder Mystery, Clambake, and Oktoberfest, which will be a two-day event. Plans are in the works for events around the World Cup schedule. Mother's Day will be Saturday, May 9 with the hope that more people will attend. Finally, the party rental calendar is getting filled.

KOC given by Katrina:

Katrina is currently serving as the interim manager at KOC. The Susan Devin Residence building was purchased in 1980s from the nuns, who were running it as a low-cost woman's residence. Afterwards it became a longer term, low-cost single room occupancy residence for both women and men. Currently there are some vacancies, but soon those rooms will start to fill up. As the building is over 100 years old it requires a lot of maintenance work. The parapet and façade need to be addressed. There is an estimate for repairs costing approximately \$300,000 at least. The elevator is also very old and replacement parts are getting harder to acquire. If the controller system breaks down there is no replacement and so the

elevator will have to be replaced costing over \$250,000. Other expenses are incurred due to various local laws that need to be complied with. The government encourages building owners to make their buildings environmentally friendly by reducing energy consumption. One of the ways this was achieved by changing light fixtures and switches, which was a sizable task. Other projects that were addressed include the sprinkler system in the laundry room and the back flow preventor in the main water line. In the last few years efforts have been made to increase the rents and cut some cost such as provisions. Lou mentioned that her Uncle Sam was a resident at KOC until last year and everyone in the residence spoke fondly of him. KOC has a great staff that helps to operate the property including shoveling snow during last storms.

K88 given by Gerhard:

The house currently has 90 % occupancy and continues to rise. Future projects include renovating the 4th floor showers. Further into the future a laundry room for tenants will be created.

President's Report given by Gerhard:

He gave his last President's report as the outgoing President. He has been on the board since 1991. Katrina has been President or Vice President since 2005. Gerhard thanked Katrina for stepping up to volunteer as the manager at KOC for 8 months already. The state of the Kolping Society is good despite the goings on with KOC. A generous donation of \$10,000 has be left by Frances Schulte upon her passing. It will be directed towards the Scholarship fund. Please keep Albert Sartorius in your prayers as he is receiving hospice care in his home. Gerhard reminded that the 45th National Convention will take place in NY on September 18-20th of this year. Members are welcome to volunteer and to participate in the various events associated with it. NYC has gotten a new Archbishop, Ronald A. Hicks, who shepherds one third of all New Yorkers.

Vice President's report given by Katrina:

Katrina expressed gratitude for having been voted in as President and Vice President for all those 24 years. She encourages members to participate at the Convention. There will be a meet and greet the Friday, the Steuben Day parade and banquet on Saturday, and the Mass at St. Patrick's and barbeque on the Sunday. She announced that Gail the bookkeeper is no longer working at the Society. Joan has been filling in for her while Natasha Borodin will be taking on the position. Finally, the Kolping Society supports various scholarships, whether high school or college, and the boy scouts in Montrose. The Society has a history with the boy scouts dating back to the time of Katrina's father and uncles and other members. She spoke of her father having fond memories of hiking Mt. Marcy, the highest point in New York State.

KOLPING GENERAL MEETING 2026 / MINUTES *continued*

Treasurer's Report given by Peter:

The Kolping Society invests for perpetuity. Investing follows strict guidelines. So far, the investments are up for the year at about 1.15%. We have been up more in the past, at times up to 15%. Our change over year is about 9% overall. We have three different investment managers, Ameriprise, Bank of New York/Mellon, and Bank of America/Merrill. Finally, in the last couple of years some cash has been invested in Treasury Bills, which averaged about 3.8% in earnings.

Tracie made a motion to accept the treasurer's report, Gerhard seconded, motion carried

2025 Membership Report given by Joan:

8 adults were inducted, 8 applicants are looking to interview, and approximately a dozen interviewed waiting to be inducted. Members in good standing include 1 Holy Trinity, 4 student, 146 individual, 160 family, and 37 honorary and exempt.

Scholarship report given by Joan:

The Scholarship committee had been run by Bob and Ann for many years. After Bob passed Joan stepped in to keep it going. Liz Kogler will be the new committee chair and is currently working on the Joseph Sartorius Scholarship, which will be announced in the Bulletin and in email very soon.

National report given by Lou, National Trustee, and Mia, National Vice President:

The National Lenten Project is in full swing and will be supporting pig farming in Kenya. One can donate via mail or directly on the National's website. Anna Stukenborg has been the Executive Director and working on bringing the Society in to the 21st century. Old and other important documents will be stored digitally and families will be able to log in and access their documents. Online payments have been implemented and has been successful. The National Scholarship is due March 30th. Encourage your eligible kids to participate. And please keep Henry Faulk, a National Trustee, in your prayers as he has been hospitalized with pneumonia.

UN Report given by Frank K via John:

The focus of the UN general actions as pertains to us is family life and children's education and the importance of parental involvement and stable support at home. When families are strengthened the children do better and communities become more stable. One of the UN's missions is a call to renewed effort around human dignity, poverty reduction, and support for families. For us its part of the Gospel. Our faith calls us to solidarity. We are responsible for one another and Kolping has always been about practical faith, helping families thrive thru work, community, education, and service. Some concrete examples of this are offering KOVA grants, providing affordable residences, and partnering with Catholic Charities.

Radio report given by Katrina:

• Last year we lost the antennae location and so the radio has been off the air. The search continues for a new spot, but we may need to look outside of the current range. It would need to be near the Somers area. Please let the Society know of any possible locations.

New Business given by John:

The vote considering the sale of KOC took place today and was counted by a paid outside party. The results are 194 in favor, 34 not in favor. At least one third, or 115, of eligible voters were needed to pass.

Karen Staub is once again donating Subway Series tickets to raffle off. Karen has chosen KOC to benefit from the proceeds. Game day is Saturday May 16th at 7:15 pm at Citifield. Tickets are \$25 each.

Praeses report given by Father Bretone:

Father Bretone has been our Praeses already for 26 years for which he is grateful. He has retired a second time and is looking forward to focusing more time on the Kolping Society. For the Convention he will con-celebrate the Mass with Archbishop Hicks and maybe Cardinal Dolan. It would be a grand opportunity to reconnect with the hierarchy of the Catholic Church in New York. This year marks the 250th anniversary of America and we are blessed to not only be together, but to be in a nation that welcomes diversity, inclusion, and religion.

Gerhard made a motion to adjourn with a prayer, mia seconded, meeting adjourned at 2:56 pm
