Petition: Kolping is sacred to me

On Tuesday, October 27, 2020 the Kolping Society of Germany starts a petition for the canonization of Adolph Kolping. On the occasion of the 30th anniversary of the beatification of our association's founder, it is planned to hand over the collected signatures to Pope Francis next year. In addition to Kolping sisters and Kolping brothers, all people worldwide who can identify with the ideas and values of Adolph Kolping are invited to support the petition with a signature.

Cologne - October 26, 2020

On October 27 of the coming year, we will celebrate the 30th anniversary of the beatification of Adolph Kolping. This is a great event and reason for many Kolping sisters and Kolping brothers worldwide to pray for the canonization of our association's founder. KOLPING INTERNATIONAL is convinced: The life and work of Adolph Kolping has charisma—up until today.

As a worldwide community of more than 400,000 members in over 60 countries we want to set an example: Kolping is sacred to me. In order to convey this to the outside world, a petition for the canonization of our association's founder will be launched on the occasion of this year's Kolping World Day of Prayer. Every signature that can be made from October 27 onwards under www.petition-kolping.com, stands for a life which has already been moved by Adolph Kolping in a very positive way.

We would like to hand over the collected signatures from all over the world to Pope Francis on the occasion of a pilgrimage to Rome for the anniversary of the beatification on October 27, 2021. KOLPING INTERNATIONAL invites you to participate in this pilgrimage. The petition will thus be running for one year. During this time it is important to collect as many signatures as possible, not only among Kolping sisters and Kolping brothers but also beyond. We would be very pleased about your active support in the various National Kolping Associations. We will provide multilingual materials which can help to spread the petition in the further course of the campaign.

The International Executive Committee of KOLPING INTERNATIONAL is in regular exchange with the responsible Congregation in the Vatican in order to underline the interest of the Association in the canonization. However, according to the current order for canonization, another medical miracle, which can be attributed to the intercession of Blessed Adolph Kolping, is required for a positive conclusion of the procedures. Pope Francis had granted a dispensation in the canonization process for Pope John XXXIII—thus the canonization was possible even without a recognized miracle. In order to also make this possible for Adolph Kolping a corresponding dispensation would have to exist as well. Therefore, the petition is to be understood as a request to Pope Francis to see the beneficial work of the Kolping Association throughout the world as a miraculous sign of the sacredness of Adolph Kolping.

KOLPING AND VOCATIONS

Did you know that our Catholic Kolping Society New York has a project directed to supporting young people who would like to explore a trade? College is only one path among many for our teenagers and it is sometimes difficult to know where to begin to explore other options.

Father Kolping worked as a shoemaker before becoming a priest and he thoroughly understood the challenges and satisfactions of being a craftsman. When he opened his first Kolping House it was to support young people as they moved away from their childhood homes to work in trades and become independent.

Funded by a generous legacy gift, the Kolping Occupational and Vocational Apostolate project contributes to defray the employer's cost of training a young person who is endeavoring to enter a particular vocational training and learn new skills.

A KOVA grant is a one-time payment to help encourage an employer to take the extra time and energy of investing in training the next generation. Applications are considered on a rolling basis. Persons interested in KOVA (employer or trainee) should email kolpingny@gmail.com. Inquiries will be forwarded to the KOVA committee for consideration.

If you have sponsored someone for membership, we will revisit the applications in the Fall with the goal of having inductions May 2021.


Kolping-on-Hudson Close Out 2020

KOLPING NY RESIDENCES

2020 & 2021 Challenges

Our flagship Kolping House—at 165 East 88th Street—has been operating for over 100 years! We have seen both hard times and good times and we have come through them because our members collaborate and work to make Father Kolping's principles and vision a reality in modern times.

Our building is set up for many uses. There are several floors of dormitory-style small bedrooms with shared bathroom on each floor; Ballroom that is used for our Society Masses and celebrations; First floor with Dining Room, Library, NY office and National Kolping Society office and archives; Lower levels with kitchen, storage, staff rooms (and reportedly a bowling alley).

Prior to March, we had over 80 men in residence at 88th Street. Our guests are predominantly foreign students and young professionals from abroad who are working internships in the NYC area. When the Ballroom was not in use for our Society functions it was rented out to a small school teaching computer coding to children in the neighborhood.

Currently, there are very few people traveling to the U.S. and the coding school is not operating in person. Our finances have taken a tremendous hit. Our talented Board of Directors has worked tirelessly to develop new sources of income, cut costs and make use of U.S. government programs set up to support small businesses in 2020.

Our Kolping on Concourse in the Bronx is also dealing with financial challenges as tenants lose jobs and find it difficult to keep up with the rent.

In preparation for more Board work brainstorming and piloting new programs to keep our Society afloat, we are asking each Kolping member to pray for inspiration and guidance for our family. Please also take a moment to think of new procedures or ideas that could be implemented and grow our revenue or decrease our expenses. Please email your ideas to kolpingny@gmail.com.
