# Stories of Interest

# AUGUST BELMONT (1816-1890)

Most people have heard of Belmont Raceway, where the stakes are held in June to determine the winner of the coveted "three-crowns" trophy. They also know of the Belmont section of the Bronx, nestled between Fordham Road and Tremont Avenue, and bounded by the Grand Concourse and the Bronx Zoo, where Arthur Avenue and Italian cuisine are romanticized.

Who was Belmont that he should be so immortalized? August Belmont was a German

immigrant who bolstered America's infantile banking industry and helped finance the expansion of the frontiers by loans to railway companies. He was also a champion of social reform and became a staunch democrat. When the civil war broke out, he helped to equip the German-American regiment with his own funds.

He was born in Rhineland-Palatinate in 1816 (some sources say 1813) to a Jewish family. At 14 years, he served as an apprentice in the Rothschild Bank at Frankfurt-on-the-Main where his administrative talents recommended him for posting in foreign capitals. His advice was sought by the Pope when he was assigned to Naples.

He arrived in New York City in the aftermath of the economic panic of 1837. Through his smart decisions and shrewd investments, he helped to make New York City an economic center. He prospered; and, between his wealth and charm, he was welcomed by the old American aristocracy. He would marry the daughter of Admiral Perry and became an icon in the American business world.

One of his outside interests was thoroughbred horse racing. He helped get it accepted in this country and opened several race tracks in the Bronx. The final one is in Elmont, in Nassau County where the stakes are to be held. Belmont died in 1890.

If a patrol car is pulled over to the side of the road, you have to change to the next lane (away from the stopped vehicle) or slow down by 20 mph.

Every state except Hawaii and Maryland and the D.C. has this law. In California, the "Move-over" law became operative on January 1, 2010.

A one-half size replica of the Vietnam moving wall was on display in Lynbrook, New York June 10th-13th. One out of every 10 Americans who served in Vietnam was a casualty. 58,262 were killed and 304,000 wounded out of 2.59 million who served.

On the wall was the name of George J. Fuerst. He was killed Nov. 19, 1969 the only son of Lena & Joe. The Fuerst family were active members of the Catholic Kolping Society.
